

WINDSOR'S 2025 LEAF COLLECTION PROGRAM STARTS ON MONDAY OCTOBER 27TH

Windsor's 2025 leaf collection program will begin on Monday October 27th and will end on Friday December 19th. During this eight-week period your leaves will be picked up on the same day as your trash pick-up.

Residents must place their leaves at the curb in 30 to 40 gallon paper leaf bags.

Leaves may also be placed in similar-sized containers that are labeled with a "Leaves
Only" sticker that can be easily identified by the driver (ie:, the sticker facing the road).

Residents can obtain these stickers at the Town Hall or the Windsor Transfer Station.

In Windsor, the transfer station accepts residents' leaves at no charge and uses them to produce compost. Leaves must be clean and must not contain other items that will compromise the quality of the mulch that will be created. These items include grass clippings, branches, or other items.

If you choose to self-haul your leaves to the transfer station, there is no charge during this period for dropping off clean loads of leaves, (no contaminants or plastic bags).

The transfer station accepts leaves Mondays and Fridays 8:00 AM to 2:45 PM, Tuesdays and Wednesdays 10:00 AM to 2:45 PM, and Saturdays 8:00 AM to 3:45 PM. Residents should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to closing to allow sufficient time to unload their vehicles. The Windsor Transfer Station is closed on Thursday and Sunday. It is located at 500 Huckleberry Road in Windsor. If you have any questions regarding recycling or composting in Windsor, please call the Transfer Station at 860-285-1833.



After years of planning, community input, and construction, Wilson Park is finally here, and it was well worth the wait.

Thanks to funding from the Connecticut Community Investment Fund and American Rescue Plan dollars, the once-vacant lot near the I-291 on-ramp has been transformed into a brand-new neighborhood park right at the entrance to the Wilson neighborhood.

Construction kicked off in summer 2024, and over the past year, the site has been steadily taking shape. One of the major additions includes a new bathroom and storage building, which will help support both day-to-day use and special events at the park.

On July 12, the community came together to celebrate the park's grand opening. Families enjoyed music, activities, and a chance to check out the new green space for the first time. It was a proud moment for the Wilson neighborhood and a sign of how powerful resident input can be in shaping local projects.

From the beginning, this park has been driven by community voices. Through surveys, conversations at events like the 2022 Block Party, and meetings with the Wilson/Deerfield Advisory Commission. Those ideas helped shape the final design, which includes walking paths, a playground, basketball courts, a pavilion, open lawn space, and areas for food trucks and events.

Wilson Park isn't just a new place to play—it's a space to gather, relax, celebrate, and connect with neighbors. It's a true community win, and we're excited to see how residents of all ages make it their own.
